WA APPALOOSA POST STATE SHOW RULES

1. The PRAC Post State Show is run under AAA Ltd rules.
2. Entries close at 9pm Saturday 18th April 2026
3. There are no refunds after close of entries unless in the death of a horse.
4. All horses must be registered with the AAA Ltd or their relevant breed association to compete in the Breed Halter Classes.
5. Any horses competing in events must be registered with the AAA Ltd, AQHA, PHAA or recognised breed societies to be eligible for these events.
6. All competitors must be current financial members of the AAA Ltd, AQHA or PHAA or recognised breed societies to be eligible for these events.
7. An insurance levy must be paid per horse/rider combination. Any competitors who may be riding for other competitors (such as trainers) must also pay the Insurance levy where applicable.
8. All strappers, handlers and non-show persons who are working with horses (including parents assisting children) must pay a \$20 insurance levy accompanied by a signed insurance waiver.
9. Copies of entered horse registration papers, association memberships, Amateur membership cards and event eligibility (Where required) must be available at request of show management.
10. All EWD competitors must provide their eligibility endorsed by their breed association accompanied by a letter from their Doctor.
11. Beginner events are Walk & Trot Only. Beginner events are run as per AAA Ltd Rule Book.
12. 3yo Led Versatility – This is for Led versatility horses only – these horses are not to be ridden or compete in any ridden events at the show.
13. All competitors and non-AAA Ltd financial members must fill out the Indemnity Waiver, which must accompany all entries.
14. Office and Program Fees are NON-REFUNDABLE.
15. Refunds On or Before Closing Date – Class Entry Fees MAY be refunded upon Death or Severe Injury of a horse, less \$10 Office Fee per horse. Written Requests MUST be accompanied by a Veterinarian Certificate and must be received by 5.00pm on the closing date. NO EXCEPTIONS.
16. Refunds After the Closing Date – Class Entry fees MAY be refunded upon Death of a horse ONLY, less office fees and 10% of the Entry Fees. Written Requests MUST be accompanied by a Veterinarian Certificate and must be received 24hrs prior to the start of the Show. NO EXCEPTIONS.
17. Written requests and Veterinarian Certificates will be tabled to our executive committee after the show. Payments will not be returned, if eligible until after an executive committee decision is made.
18. Every horse entered in the competition shall be under the control of the Show Manager or such person/s she appoints to act on his behalf.

19. Only contestants in the specific classes and show officials will be allowed in the competition arena or marshalling area during the judging.
20. Riders and handlers must always be correctly attired in show arenas including western hat/helmet and riding boots. Any person not correctly attired will not be allowed into the Show Arenas.
21. Show management reserve the right to change the order of classes before or during the show. It is the responsibility of the exhibitor to be aware of any changes which will be posted at the Show Secretary's office and announced. Every endeavour will be made to give one hour's notice of any changes to the running order of events; however, every step will be made to avoid changes.
22. Any exhibitor or rider who refuses to obey the request of the Judge, Show Manager or any show official will be automatically disqualified from further competition at the show and forfeits all previous winnings together with all entry fees and other charges. At the discretion of the Show Manager or show committee, the offending individual and his/her entire exhibit may be removed from the grounds.
23. The disputes committee shall consist of the Show Manager, one show committee member and one competitor.
24. Protests must be made in writing to the show secretary and be lodged within 30 minutes of the completion of the disputed event. A cash fee of \$50 must accompany any protest.
25. Youth ages will be as of 1st August each year, and all youth competitors must have the written permission of a parent or guardian or legal guardian to compete.
26. If a horse is vetted out, and it has been entered for competition in a youth event, then that youth can use a replacement horse if the replacement horse has been previously entered in the show. It should be noted that once this has taken place the horse that was vetted out is not allowed to compete in the rest of the show in any classes.
27. All youth competing or taking part in an AQHA approved event, must have written permission from their parent/guardian to be at that event as a contestant or participant and in the case of a contestant, the parent/guardian must also sign the entry form. All youth competing or taking part in an AQHA approved event must be in the care of a responsible adult who is in attendance for the duration of that event, whilst the youth attend that event.
28. Youth competitors can nominate a maximum of two horses to count towards their High Point awards.
29. If an Amateur Performance Horse has been vetted out, the Amateur will be permitted to use a replacement horse so long as the replacement horse has previously been entered in the Show. The replacement horse must be Owned/Leased by the Amateur or their Immediate Family as per AAA Ltd Rules. No substitution will be permitted for any Amateur event with a conformation aspect i.e., Amateur Halter or Amateur Hunter in Hand
30. Please Note: In Amateur Select horse age restrictions do not apply.
31. Amateur competitors can nominate a maximum of only two horses that will count towards their High Point awards.
32. Led versatility horses (any age) are not permitted to be ridden at the show.
33. All event patterns will be posted at least one hour prior to the commencement of the show.

34. No alcohol is allowed in, or can be consumed in the marshalling areas, working arenas or show pen/contest areas.
35. Competitor's/participants at any event run by AAA Ltd always have a responsibility to ensure the welfare of their horses and to treat their horses humanely and with dignity, respect, and compassion.
36. Competitors/participants are to conduct themselves in a professional manner and act with integrity in all dealings with the Affiliate and other competitors. To always uphold the rules and regulations of the PRAC and the AAA.
37. Competitors/participants are to always demonstrate good sportsmanship, showing respect for your fellow competitors and officials, following the rules and to treat people the way you yourself wish to be treated.
38. In the case of outbreak of any contagious or infectious disease amongst horses, neither the PRAC committee nor the sponsors or show organisers will be liable for any damage or loss that may occur to any person or animal.
39. Competitors realize that horse related competition has an inherent risk and as such compete at this competition at their own risk. The PRAC show committee will accept no liability for accident, loss, or injury. This applies to all competitors, their connections, horses, and spectators.
40. First aid officers are available on the grounds available by contacting the show committee. A full AAA biosecurity plan is available at the show office.
41. All horses must be serviceably sound. In a case of suspected unsoundness, the Judge and/or Show Management may dismiss the horse from showing in the show.
42. All buildings are NO SMOKING ZONES so please observe this ruling.
43. Competitors/participants are to conduct themselves in a professional manner and act with integrity.
44. Dogs are not recommended on the grounds. If you must bring a dog, it must be kept in the camping area. Strictly NO DOGS ALLOWED in arena and spectator areas.
45. Any rider 18 years and under is required to always wear a helmet when riding on the grounds AT ALL TIMES, unless in a Western performance event where a western hat is worn. This is a council ground rule.
46. Closed-toed shoes must be worn at all times in the arena, marshaling or horse working areas including the wash bays. The wearing of sandals and/or thong-type shoes is not permitted when working with horses at any time.
47. There is no tying to the arena, marshal yard fencing, or the new stable block poles.
(Beware of taps and electrical outlets)
48. No one will be permitted in the marshalling area who is not entered in the show or has not submitted a strappers levy and indemnity form (Provided in your entry pack)
